Like the 1571, the C-128 has an older ROM and The differences between the two a newer ROM. are less serious than is the case with a 1571. The easiest way to tell the difference is to click down the CAPS LOCK key and hit O while in BASIC direct mode. If you see a lower case q, then you have an older ROM. If you see an upper case Q, then you have a newer ROM.

MONITOR CABLES: Some Commodores have a five (5) pin cable socket, others have eight (8) pins. If you bought an 8 pin monitor connector cable and it won't go into your 5 pin socket, then get out the pliers and rip out pins numbered 6,7 and 8. These pins up near the notch make no connection. Pin 6 in the middle was the chroma signal output on the 8 pin DIN system, but isn't needed on the 5 pin connection you need.

PET CORNER

When I was asked if I could write something for PET CORNER, I wondered whether I could find any information on PET, other than the four-legged kind. I'm not very well versed in PET language, but I did manage to find one neat program that I would like to pass on to you.

One early offering from PET Gazette was a program called "BURROW":

(A\$,RND(.5)*4+1,1)'*[left]';: FORI=1TO30:NEXT:
PRINT':[rvs on][space][left]';:GOTO1

It fits on one 40-column line, and it does get exciting.

Trick 1. You can fit lots of statements onto one program line by using the abbreviations for BASIC keywords from the appendix of your user's manual. When the line is listed, the keywords are printed out in full, so your program line might take up more than the usual number of screen lines.

This is no problem, but if you try to edit the long line, your computer will cut it down to normal program line size. So use abbreviations to pack the statements into a line, but be careful when editing it later.

Trick 2. All 16 Commodore 64 colors can be called up from the keyboard, but only eight of them are marked on the keys. If you put a 6-inch piece of masking tape above the number keys 1-8, you can mark it with the other colors to make your life easier.

The colors are called by pressing the C= Logo key simultaneously with a number key. From left to right, they are orange, brown, light red, dark gray, medium gray, light green, light blue and light gray.

That's enough rambling for this edition. I'll be back next time with some more helpful tricks.




