#### NEWBY CORNER by Dan Koleski

I don't have quite as many tips and hints this month, but I will try to give you what I do have. First of thought, the best tip I can give you is to hang on to that C64/C128 computer you have. Commodore is far from dead.

Ok, now that I got that off of my chest, lets get down to some tips.

From the C=H.U.G. Gazette club of Fremont, Ca came the following tip called "EASY DISK DRIVE RESET". it reads-When your drive gets temporarily confused, you can reset it without touching the keyboard or risking the loss of your program. Just reach behind the drive and turn its power switch off. Wait a few seconds, then turn it on again, you will be reset and your program will be perfectly safe because the computer itself isn't affected.

From the pages of the Cincinnati Commodore Computer Club or the FOUR "C" ER came the following tip. If your fingers are large, you may find the reset button almost impossible to use, even with your pinky. Get a piece of Radio Shack shrink tubing, slide it over the button, and use a blow dryer to heat it for about ten seconds. If you leave about 3/8 of an inch of tubing exposed, you'll be able to reset the computer with your index finger. And you'll be less likely to accidentally turn off the computer.
