I have been sidetracked and delayed for quite a while on doing the site's update lately. However, I have been working on a complete rearrangement of our pages.

One major thing I'm doing is breaking up the main page of our site. (http://home.pacifier.com/~alberonn/ acug.html) The front page was getting to big to easily move around. I'm turning the front page more into an index page to the other sections of the site. I'll bee adding an introduction Page, a news page, a files page, and a page with information about our BBS. All the other pages with the Links and images to link to our site will be cleaned up a bit and I'll start on the

rewrite of those pages as well.

Other things I've been doing is cleaning up a lot of the HTML code. I found an HTML validater on the internet that allows me to upload my HTML code and then it tells me where there are any problems. I'm working on having my page validate as proper HTML v4.0. Supposedly, this will make sure my site looks pretty much the same to all graphic browsers and if I watch what I'm doing, should be still fine for Lynx user's.

I also located an Amiga Port of Tidy. Tidy goes through my HTML document and finds (and tried to fix) any major errors. You can have the program output to a file a list of problems that may have cropped up and allow you to know where you have to go to fix problems that Tidy cannot handle.

I am hoping all of this will end up with a better and cleaner webpage for the ACUG. I have gotten good response form those who have seen the work in progress at the shop.

I found a site that will also host our page so I can separate it from my Pacifier account. Our New Mail List The Amiga-Commodore User's group has a new feature available not only to our member, but for any interested in the Commodore and Amiga computer platforms. We now have an internet e-mail mailing list.

For those of you who don't know what this is, it isn't too complex. What happens is that whenever you send an email to the list, that message goes to everyone who is part of that list. (Including yourself.) This is somewhat reminiscent of the "Message Bases" of the BBS systems, except this get sent to you e-mail account.

One bad side to this is that some lists can generate a lot of e-mail. Some lists (like our's,) give you the option of getting a "digest" version. In our case all the posts for one day are combined into one larger e-mail message. Our list also has the option for it not to send you any e-mail, but you can access the list via the World Wide Web and read and respond to the posts online. (You'd still be able to directly send a message to the list via email.) Some lists also have other features available via the web as well

The mailing lists are often a good place to get help with technical problems or just to brag about the new toy you got for your computer. What is normally acceptable topics vary depending on the list you're on.

Our list is for generic discussion on the Commodore and Amiga computer systems. Requests for help are welcome and we'll try to answer the best we can or try to figure out where'd be the best place to look. We welcome new users as well as the more experienced crowd. We are a very informal list. Under e-group's policies, spamming is prohibited, and will not be tolerated by me, the list's owner.

The service we're going through, (egroups,) allows you to easily create you own mail lists and is host to several Amiga mail lists that I know of, and I wouldn't be too surprised to see more then a few Commodore lists on there as well. Egroups dies have a search option to allow you to locate groups you may be interested in joining.



I have tested the site with iBrowse 2.2, AWeb-II, and Voyager 3.2 on the Amiga. I have been successful with accessing the site with Lynx using my Unix shell account and my C128.

With the addition of Set 4, I now have Aminet Sets #1-4 and I'll be working on getting the rest of the CD's. This gives me more programs immediately available for our club member's pleasure.
