Well it finally came. What is "it"? You say. Well "it" is Wheels 128. This is an upgrade to Geos. Which we have needed badly for a long time. Mr. Maurice Randall has worked on this upgrade for a long time. He

can't call it Geos because the name Geos is still a copyrighted name, still held by Berkeley Softworks. This new upgrade is made to work with ALL of CMDs equipment. It knows how to go to any device and any partition on a CMD device. That means it can boot from your RAMLink, your Hardrive, and any floppy drive. It can have 4 drives open at one time.

Wheels works well with CMDs SuperCPU at 20 MHz. But the load speed from a 5-inch drive is not a lot faster than normal. But that may be cause it has a lot more work to do as it is booted into the computer. Wheels will also work in a native mode partition on any CMD device. This means you can have a partition as big as

1.6 Mb OR bigger and Wheels will run in it. Wheels is the operating system it does not come with any applications. You use your old well known apps. Like Geowrite, etc. One thing Wheels does require is a ram expansion unit. It can be the smallest one made, but it does need one. I am just getting started using it but it is easy to use. Mr. Randall has a great warranty and replacement policy.

During the first 30 days, your disk will be replaced regardless of who is at fault. It's a hard warranty to beat. One thing that this system can do that Commodore users have not had before is subdirectories, I don't know how it use them yet but they look like they can be of use, when one can store so much data. This Wheels upgrade is what Goes should have been. It adds so much more than Geos ever had that it is really a different O.S. I think this Wheels will give Commodores a new lease on life. And I am glad he couldn't use the Geos name. I think you will see many new apps. Written just for Wheels and CMDs new equipment. Also if it weren't for CMDs SuperCPU these other things would not be of much use. So with this new combination of equipment great new things are about to happen in the Commodore world.


Puzzled, one student raised his hand and asked, "What gender is computer?"
